Teen Scholarship Requirements.

- Eligibility: Teens (under 20 years of age) who are active members in a dance- related club (member of the North Texas Square and Round Dance Association). They must have been a member for at least one year after completion of lessons and continue to be active in dance activities related to that club. 3.
- Nominations and applications for scholarship awards shall be made in such form and format as may be determined by the members of the NORTEX Teen Scholarship Fund but will require the following information: (1) Completed NORTEX Application Scholarship Form; (2) A letter from a club officer in the nominee's home club attesting to the nominee's active membership; (3) Two letters of recommendation (one of the letters must be from an educator); (4) A copy of the official high school transcript, state certification, or GED.
- Selection will take into consideration the following qualifications: High degree of moral character, special scholastic or personal achievement, Demonstrated leadership ability. Scholarships will be awarded without consideration or preference to sex, disability, race, color, creed and national or ethnic origin. Additionally, no preference will be accorded any application by reason of a parental affiliation or position.
