


Bullwinkle's Korner....

A TRUE TALE


About two centuries ago Molly Cogan of Kilmallock told the famous folklorist Thomas Crofton Croker about a leprechaun her grandfather had met, and even caught.

It happened like this: one night as he went to the stable to tend his old mare, Grandpa Cogan heard something 'hammering, hammering, hammering just for all the world like a shoemaker making a shoe, and whistling all the time the prettiest tune he ever heard his whole life before.'

He guessed what might be making the sound and. remembering tales of leprechauns and their gold, he crept in. He looked around but 'never a bit of the little man could he see anywhere, but he heard him hammering and whistling and so he looked and looked, till at last did he see the little fellow.


'And where was he, do you think, but in the girth under the mare, and there he was with his

And my own mother told me she often saw it, and had it in her hand, and 'twas the prettiest little shoe she ever saw.'

- Leprechauns are shoemakers.
- Some stories say they hide their gold coins in a pot at the end of the rainbow.
- Did you know that Leprechauns originally wore red! According to the book Legends and Stories of Ireland published in 1831, leprechauns wore red and a cocked (tri-cornered) hat, shoes and buckles.
- According to legend Leprechauns dance the Irish jig so much they wear out their shoes.
- The original name for Leprechaun was lobaircin meaning small-bodied fellow.
- Some stories about leprechauns say that they are mischievous other stories say they are harmless creatures that keep to themselves.
- Some legends say leprechaun carry one gold coin for every year they have been alive
